Texting/Cellular Phone Use While Driving Prohibited

Effective July 1, 2010 drivers under 18 years of age with an instruction permit or Class D license

are prohibited by Georgia law, O.C.G.A. 40-6-241.1 to use a wireless communication device while

driving a motor vehicle.

A wireless communication device includes:

- Cellular Phone
- Text messaging device
- Personal digital assistant (PDA)
- Stand alone computer
- Any other wireless device used to initiate or receive wireless communication

Any conviction for violation will result in a fine of \$150 and one (1) point will be assessed by the Department of Driver Services towards suspension or revocation of the license held by a habitually negligent or dangerous drivers.
