Founded in 1970, as McDonough Christian Academy, Eagle's Landing Christian Academy is located in a suburban, residential community located 25 miles south of Atlanta. The school operates as a ministry of Eagle's Landing First Baptist Church. Traditional and online classes are offered along with programs for students with learning differences.

STUDENTS

Students are admitted to ELCA on the basis of previous school record, standardized test scores, recommendation, and an interview. The school seeks to enroll students from all socio-economic and ethnic backgrounds. ELCA admits students without regard to race, color, religion, gender, or national or ethnic origin. Three hundred and eighty-five students were enrolled in grades nine through twelve, with a senior class of 81.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

In order to graduate from Eagle's Landing Christian Academy, a student must earn a total of 26 high school credits, taken in high school, distributed as follows:

The academic program is organized around a 7 period day with the school year divided into two semesters.

Honors classes are offered in all academic disciplines. Students must have a teacher recommendation to enroll. The earliest year students may take AP classes is ninth grade. Students may enroll in AP classes with the approval of parent, teacher, and Academic Dean. Students enrolled in an AP course may elect not to sit for the national exam.

STANDARDIZED TESTING

All students take the ACT Aspire and the PSAT in grades nine, ten, and eleven.

CLASS RANK

Eagle's Landing Christian Academy does NOT provide a specific numerical class rank for the purpose of college admission. GPA is calculated using the following scale. Beginning with 9th grade, all subjects, whether passed or failed, are included in the computation. The transcript reflects a weighted and unweighted cumulative overall and cumulative academic GPA (English, math, science, social studies, and foreign language). Semester grades in Honors courses are weighted .25 per semester on the GPA scale. AP courses are weighted .5 per semester on the GPA scale.

NOTEWORTHY PROGRAMS

Student Leadership Institute: ELCA Student Leadership Institute is a voluntary, yearlong program opened to all students in grades 9 through 12. Students must apply for entrance to the program. The program consists of 4 basic parts: Group sessions, Leadership Training Modules, Campus Connections, and Christian Service.

ELCA World Impact: ELCA World Impact extends curriculum beyond the classroom to provide students with cultural, educational, and ministerial experiences both locally and around the world. Some of the trips offered for 2016-2017 include: Alaska, Costa Rica, Jamaica, New Orleans, Nicaragua, and London.

ELCA Connect: If a traditional ELCA student desires to take a class not offered within traditional ELCA curricula, they may take that class in the ELCA Connect program if approved by the Academic Dean.

Student Support Services/MERIT: (Multi-faceted Educational Resources and Instructional Technology) provides assistance to our students who have diagnosed, documented learning differences. Students who are served by the MERIT Program must be identified through a multi-faceted evaluation as exhibiting a learning difference that significantly impedes their academic progress. A current (within the last three years) comprehensive evaluation of the student's cognitive, academic achievement, social, behavioral, etc. domains must be on file at the school.
